
## Mushroom-like costal exostosis as a result of an incisional biopsy

A year later, he presented with a left supraclavicular palpable mass (Figure 1). The excisional biopsy of the mass, including part of the first rib, through an axillary incision, showed an exostosis-recurrence of the osteochondroma, as a result of the original incisional biopsy (Figure 2).
